

From France to Freycinet Festival 2014

The biennial From 'France to Freycinet Festival' is back for 2014, celebrating the region's rich French heritage of Baudin and Freycinet. The Festival will be held this year from 3rd to 6th April based mainly in Swansea and Triabunna.



As part of the Festival, activities will be held at The Village in Triabunna, including the launching of the festival on the 3rd April at The Village with a 'Welcome to Country' and an exhibition opening of works by print maker, John Ingleton "Travelling Tasmanians III".

On Sunday 6th there will be a special craft market and lunch. There will be also be a French Car Show, with vehicles expected from the French Car Club of Tasmania, the Citroen Car Club of Tasmania and new cars from French makes such as Renault and Peugeot. Cars will be displayed on the Lawns and an award will be made to the "Best in Show" to be voted on by the public.

Other activities planned include French Dinner at the Swansea Bark Mill Tavern on 4th April; Swansea Primary School Kite Festival on 4th; East Coast Heritage Museum lunch and talk by John
