thank the Glamorgan Spring Bay Council for their grant which has enable the floor to be concreted and made safe. During these works we found that unlike most buildings it appeared the roof was holding up the walls!!! This has now been rectified. However we are in need of some vertical board cladding to complete the job - Please contact Tom if you are able to help. We are very mindful of the need to retain the character of the buildings.

Plans for the renovation of the existing "L shaped" shed have been drawn up and funding has been received from Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal (FRRR) for Stage 1 - Lock up storage and we should be commencing work within the next month. We have also applied for funding of Stage 2 - the Billiard Room and hopefully we should know about that in September. An application will be made to the Tasmanian Community Fund for funds to complete the project - Stage 3 & 4, undercover market area and pottery studio.

FROM FRANCE TO FREYCINET: ERDO will be assisting in the planning for the next 'From France to Freycinet Festival'. Dates have now been set for the 2014 Festival, commencing Thursday 3rd April through to 6th April 2014. Events are being planned in various locations including an art exhibition at The Village opening on 3rd and The Village Market and Long Lunch on Sunday 6th. Events are being organised in Swansea and we encourage Bicheno and Coles Bay to promote events in their towns.
