Today's attraction From Britain to 'Bunna



This is the second British Car Show that ERDO & the Tasmanian Register of the Rover Car Club of Australia have hosted here at The Village in Triabunna.

The RCCA celebrated its 50th Anniversary in 2014. Established in Victoria, the club attracted members from Tasmania right from the start.



Club members will have on display today models ranging from late 1940's P3 to the last model Rover 75/MG ZT sold in

Australia.

Our definition of "British" is fairly broad, It includes British Motor companies that may have manufactured their cars outside UK.

For example the Rover P6B 3500 was assembled in New Zealand and from 1971 to 1976, more than 2,500 cars were imported to Australia during that time.



The Nelson plant was also assembling Jaguar XJ6 and Triumph 2000/2500 cars.

On the other hand, some non British manufacturers made cars in Britain makes such as Honda which had an agreement with Rover to manufacture the Legend along side the Rover 800 series.

Of course these days many of the companies that manufacture in UK are not

"British" owned.
